


Create your own "Boat" Activity Sheet

4. This boat will be your pawn. You are now ready to play the Board game.




The Map of Africa Activity Sheet

6. Color the Mediterranean Sea, the Red Sea, the Atlantic Ocean and the Indian Ocean in blue.




Cobra and vulture, symbols of the Pharaohs.

The Pharaohs ruled over two kingdoms: Lower Egypt (the part of Egypt closer to the Mediterranean Sea), whose symbol was the cobra, and Upper Egypt (the part further away from the Mediterranean Sea), whose symbol was the vulture.

Cleopatra wears cobra bracelets around her arms and the vulture crown on her head.



1. Color the cobra and vulture symbols.





Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.


The Great Pyramid in Egypt was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

The Seven Wonders of the Ancient World were the most impressive man-made monuments at the time of Cleopatra. They were all located in the area around the Mediterranean Sea.



The Great Pyramid and the Alexandria lighthouse in Egypt were two of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World. Six of these Seven Wonders have been destroyed over time by earthquakes or wars. Only the Pyramid in Egypt still exists today!

Carriage: a vehicle with wheels that is usually pulled by horses.

Cleopatra's carriage was not pulled by horses, but was carried by many servants.

Cobra: a large, poisonous snake that can spread the skin around its neck.

The cobra was the symbol of Lower Egypt.

Dazzle: to impress, amaze or surprise.

Cleopatra's beauty and charm dazzled many people.

Delta: before flowing into the sea or the ocean, some large rivers form a delta, which is an area of land, water and mud. This area is often shaped like a fan or like a triangle.

Before flowing into the Mediterranean Sea, the Nile river branches out into many smaller rivers, forming a large delta.

Enchanting: charming.

Cleopatra's voice was enchanting.

Fancy: very decorated, very elegant, the opposite of simple and plain.

Cleopatra's palace was fancy.

Ferocious: violent, savage.

The crocodile can be a ferocious animal.

Gorgeous: very beautiful.

Cleopatra was a gorgeous queen.

Marvel: a wonderful or amazing thing.

The Great Pyramid of Egypt was a real marvel.

Mission: a special task or work that someone has to do.

Cleopatra's mission was to stop the Romans from conquering Egypt.

Papyrus: a tall water plant that grows near the Nile River in Egypt.

The paper that was made in Ancient Egypt using the papyrus plant is also called papyrus.

Petals: the colored leaves that are part of a flower.

Cleopatra filled her boat with thousands of petals from the rose flower.

Pharaoh: the title given to the kings or queens of Ancient Egypt.

Cleopatra was the last Pharaoh.

Learn New Words Activity Sheet 2/2

Pyramid: An object that has four sides shaped like triangles that meet at one point at the top. The Ancient Egyptians built many pyramids.

Reptile: an animal with dry skin, short legs and a long, low body. Crocodiles, snakes and lizards are all reptiles.

Serpent: a snake.
Cleopatra wore bracelets that had the shape of a serpent.

Shine: to be bright. To give light (for a thing), or to be brilliant (for a person). Objects can shine, like a star, and people can shine, like Cleopatra.

Sparkle: to shine with flashes of light (for a thing), or to be brilliant and lively (for a person). Objects can sparkle, like a star or a diamond, and people can sparkle, like Cleopatra.

Symbol: an object or a sign chosen to represent something else. The cobra was the symbol of Lower Egypt and the vulture was the symbol of Upper Egypt. The bald eagle is the symbol of the United States.

Twinkle: to shine with flashes of light.
The stars seem to twinkle in the sky on a clear night.
Did you notice that sparkle and twinkle have similar meanings?

Unroll: to unfold and open something that was rolled up.
Julius Caesar discovered Cleopatra when the rug was unrolled.

Vulture: a large bird with dark feathers and without hair on the head.
The vulture was the symbol of Upper Egypt.

Wonder: something that is unusually impressive and that causes admiration or amazement. The Great Pyramid of Egypt was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.
Did you notice that wonder and marvel have similar meanings?

Wrap: to circle or fold around something.
Cleopatra wrapped around her arms bracelets that had the shape of a snake.
